4½ MILE FUN WALK ROUTE DIRECTIONS

Orange Arrows have been placed around the entire route for you to follow.

If you require assistance at any time then call **07804 268389**.

Note: The step numbers below correspond to the numbers on the Route Map sheet.

1. Out of the Royal Oak Inn (The Splash) car park and turn left (Watery Lane) and carry on passed the duck pond to the end of the road.
2. Turn left on to Muckton Road (as marked).
Stay on this road for approx 1.9 miles taking you past the sign for Muckton  and following a long sweeping bend to the left followed by a tight bend to the right.
On this bend choose the route you wish to take.

Off Road Walking Route

This route could take you through mud, wet grass and puddles if it has been raining!

3. On this bend turn left into the junction (as marked) and follow the road round to the left (going past barns on the right) continuing for approx 0.5 miles until you reach a fork in the road.
4. Take the right fork (off road track) and continue until you reach a 'T' section (as marked).
5. Turn left and follow the track until you reach the woods (as marked).
6. Turn left and continue until you reach a set of gates on the left marked as Legbourne Woods (as marked).
7. Go through the gates and down to the right following the old train tracks straight until you reach another set of gates.
8. Go through the gates into the car park and take a left onto Wood Lane (as marked).
Carry on the road until you see the ford on the left hand side.
9. Turn left and walk alongside the ford (as marked).
10. Turn left over the footbridge and left again to "The Royal Oak".

Road Walking Route

This route will keep you on roads only!

3. On this bend turn around at the junction (as marked) and follow the road back for approx 1.9 miles to the junction with Watery Lane.
4. Continue past Watery Lane along Top Road and Pinfold Lane to go around the village.
5. Turn right at the junction into Buston Lane (as marked).
6. Turn right into Watery Lane, over the footbridge and left into "The Royal Oak".
